Property Crime 2024 Salem

This theme presents an overview of Property Crimes for the selected jurisdiction and year.

Property Crime data is collected in New Hampshire via detailed incident reports using the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). These reports are completed after the preliminary investigation of a call for service or complaint.

This theme only accounts for the reports made by Law Enforcement and not the findings of a court, coroner, jury, or prosecutor.

Focus is on those crimes where offenders take possession of another person's property by unlawful means. These include Robbery, Burglary, Larceny/Theft, Fraud, Embezzlement, Extortion/Blackmail, Motor Vehicle Theft and Arson.


EXTORTION/BLACKMAIL










Stolen and Recovered by Vehicle Type
