Violent Crime data is collected in New Hampshire via detailed incident reports using the National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS). These reports are completed after the preliminary investigation of a call for service or complaint.

This theme only accounts for the reports made by Law Enforcement and not the findings of a court, coroner, jury, or prosecutor.


VIOLENT CRIME

Violent Crime consists of Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery and Aggravated Assault.




Arrestees are counted for having been involved in the violent crime regardless of the crime(s) for which they were charged.




The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.




















AGGRAVATED ASSAULT


An unlawful attack by one person upon another wherein the offender uses a weapon or displays it in a threatening manner, or the victim suffers obvious severe or aggravated bodily injury involving apparent broken bones, loss of teeth, possible internal injury, severe laceration, or loss of consciousness. This also includes assault with disease (as in cases when the offender is aware that he/she is infected with a deadly disease and deliberately attempts to inflict the disease by biting, spitting, etc.).




















ROBBERY







VIOLENT SEX OFFENSES

Any sexual act directed against another person, without the consent of the victim, including instances where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
